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pauliina remes and juha sihvola in the course of history philosophers have given an impressive variety of answers to the question what is self some of them have even argued that there is no such thing at all this volume explores the various ways in which selfhood was approached and conceptualised in antiquity how did the ancients understand what it is that i am fundamentally as an acting and affected subject interpreting the world around me being distinct from others like and unlike me the authors hi light the attempts in ancient philosophical sources to grasp the evasive character of the specifically human presence in the world they also describe how the ancient philosophers understood human agents as capable of causing changes and being affected in and by the world attention will be paid to the various ways in which the ancients conceived of human beings as subjects of reasoning and action as well as responsible individuals in the moral sphere and in their relations to other people the themes of persistence identity self examination and self improvement recur in many of these essays the articles of the collection combine systematic and historical approaches to ancient sources that range from socrates to plotinus and augustine

a magisterial mappa mundi of the terrain that pierre hadot has so productively worked for decades this ambitious work revises our view of ancient philosophy and in doing so proposes that we change the way we see philosophy itself hadot takes ancient philosophy out of its customary realm of names dates and arid abstractions and plants it squarely in the thick of life through a meticulous historical reading he shows how the various schools trends and ideas of ancient greek and roman philosophy all tended toward one goal to provide a means for achieving happiness in this life by transforming the individual s mode of perceiving and being in the world most pressing for hadot is the question of how the ancients conceived of philosophy he argues in great detail systematically covering the ideas of the earliest greek thinkers hellenistic philosophy and late antiquity that ancient philosophers were concerned not just to develop philosophical theories but to practice philosophy as a way of life a way of life to be suggested illuminated and justified by their philosophical discourse for the ancients philosophical theory and the philosophical way of life were inseparably linked what is ancient philosophy also explains why this connection broke down most conspicuously in the case of academic professional philosophers especially under the influence of christianity finally hadot turns to the question of whether and how this connection might be reestablished even as it brings ancient thoughts and thinkers to life this invigorating work provides direction for those who wish to improve their lives by means of genuine philosophical thought

philosophers didn t always busy themselves with life s big questions the earliest ancient philosophers were primarily concerned with the world of nature including phenomena such as earthquakes and eclipses but one enigmatic greek named socrates began to explore abstract ideas about human existence what makes us happy what is the nature of the soul and what is our purpose in this universe professor william prior elegantly guides readers through philosophy s formative years and key ancient texts organised into four themes nature reality the soul and ethics ancient philosophy a beginner s guide is a lively introduction to the great thinkers who still send our minds reeling today

this book is intended as an introductory text into ancient philosophy it focuses primarily on epistemology and metaphysics it covers plato aristotle parmenides and heraclitus and compares some of these authors to the ancient chinese philosopher lao tzu it also includes a section on women in ancient greek philosophy this edition is intended for university students who only want to read the important material in the author and skim past the unnecessary elaborations each section starts with an introduction summarising the authors basic

positions cites an abridged version of the original text and then ends with a criticism of the material the guttenberg press versions have been abridged commented on and corrected with underlines and bold font on the key phrases sentences and arguments important arguments issues to consider and comparisons to other authors are made in sticky notes next to each underlined paragraph where appropriate

the period spanning approximately 624 545 bc to 175 225 ad is often considered the most exciting in western philosophy designed as a companion to the original works of the ancient philosophers from this early period this introductory text spotlights seminal thinkers including the sophists offers a detailed analysis of the thoughts and teachings of socrates plato and aristotle and features a well rounded assessment of the hellenistic and roman philosophers examining epicureanism stoicism and skepticism thomson s comprehensive treatment features accessible explanations of the philosophers central arguments in metaphysics epistemology ethics and politics he presents critical assessments of the philosophers views and recounts some of the major interpretations of the original texts by noted scholars
