psychotherapy is a patchwork of different methods and schools for established therapists and young trainees alike it can be a challenge to see the wood for the trees let alone to choose between the specialized schools of therapy most books on this subject tend to be either very scientific and rather boring to read or they have been written from a particular perspective usually promoting some form of psychotherapy
