concentrated there were some of the richest and most expansive plantations of the south it was an unhealthy region for both blacks and whites slavery in the swamps was administered with particular severity focusing on three of the largest plantations dusinberre presents portraits of individuals both black and white who personify and exemplify the harsh realities of the slave system them dark days offers a vivid reconstruction of slavery in action while it conveys the atmosphere and daily routine of the plantations it also sets the analysis of slave culture within a wider context of health discipline privilege and psychology

the geologically ancient tidewater region of southeastern virginia and northeastern north carolina rests precariously atop millions of years of erosion from the nearby appalachian mountains an immense wetland at near sea level it is host to every conceivable body of fresh water ranging from brooding swamps and large hidden lakes to sluggish blackwater rivers and brackish sounds one of which was so large an early explorer thought he had found the pacific ocean in this engaging book biologist and tidewater native roy t sawyer delivers an ecohistory of this unique waterland whose wind driven tides cover a rich human and natural past jutting prominently into the atlantic this wetland is the final stop for the warmth of the gulf stream before it is deflected from the american mainland at the top of a narrow warm coastal strip it provides an ideal home for a vast array of animal and plant life including prodigious numbers of reptiles such as the world s northernmost population of alligators and overwintering waterfowl it is also home to the oldest known living trees east of the rocky mountains the climate and geography made the area a natural choice for very early human habitation as far back as the last ice age when the region was a rich oasis just south of a veritable tundra in examining the impact of humans upon this environment and vice versa sawyer reveals how our alarming shortsightedness has produced a fragile and endangered present although human manipulation started here as early as ten thousand years ago coinciding with extinction of mammoths and other megafauna the environment has been altered most radically over only the last one hundred years particularly in regard to land drainage deforestation overfishing and pollution the author provides an authoritative overview of the human impact on these wetlands and suggests ways in which we might still salvage them in so doing he explores the effects of hurricanes droughts forest fires and ice ages of the past and anticipates in this age of global warming natural events that may be still to come

In 1900 very few historians were exploring the institution of slavery in the South but in the next half century the culture of slavery became a dominating theme in Southern historiography. In the 1970s it was the subject of the first Chancellor's Symposium in Southern History held at the University of Mississippi. Since then scholarly interest in slavery has proliferated ever more widely. In fact the editor of this retrospective volume states that since the 1970s the expansion has resulted in a corpus that has a huge number of components, scores even hundreds rather than mere dozens. He states that no such gathering could possibly summarize all the changes of those twenty-five years. Hence for the Chancellor Porter L. Fortune Symposium in Southern History in the year 2000 instead of providing historiographical summary the participants were invited to formulate thoughts arising from their own special interests and experiences. Each paper was complemented by a learned penetrating reaction. On balance the editor avers in his introduction reflection about the whole can convey a further sense of the condition of this field of scholarship at the very end of the last century which was surely an improvement over what prevailed at the beginning. Winter, Professor of History and Professor of African American Studies at the University of Mississippi. His previous books include *White Over Black: American Attitudes toward the Negro 1550-1812* and *The White Man's Burden: Historical Origins of Racism in the United States* and his work has been published in the *Atlantic Monthly*, *Daedalus*, and the *Journal of Southern History* among other periodicals.
