today's kindergarten teachers face enormous challenges to reach district mandated academic standards this book presents a model for 21st century kindergartens that is rooted in child centered learning and also shaped by the needs and goals of the present day classroom teachers working with diverse populations of students and focusing on issues of social justice provide vivid descriptions of classroom life across urban and rural communities teacher reflections and commentary from the editors link teacher decisions to principles of good practice teaching kindergarten illustrates how a progressive learning centered approach can not only meet the equity and accountability goals of the common core state standards but go well beyond that to educate the whole child

partnership with parents in early childhood settings examines how practitioners can work effectively with parents and families acknowledging the complex nature of these relationships drawing on policy research and practice from kindergartens and early years settings in five european countries it provides insight into how political social and cultural contexts affect the relationships between educators and families and the impact this has on children s early experiences the book is based upon learning from an erasmus mobility project between educators from five countries in omepe the world organisation for early childhood education it presents examples from practice and research from the different countries and highlights some positive and practical ways in which professionals can work with parents as well as potential barriers to parental partnership and how these might be overcome each section focuses on a different country and allows for a detailed exploration into how relationships are developed and sustained for the benefit of young children and their families in different places throughout the reader is encouraged to reflect on their current understanding of parental partnership and how they can plan for positive parental partnership working in the future this thought provoking text will be an indispensable resource for students of early childhood and teachers and practitioners as well as academics and those with an interest in early years social and educational policy

many world class thinkers and creators have been concerned about the state of education in the united states discover their

thoughts on how children really learn and what teachers must do to optimally tap children's latent abilities during the last three decades education reformers have pushed standardized testing and policies like no child left behind and common core to improve test scores and proficiency in basic skills however during this period that author thomas armstrong calls the miseducation of america a number of troubling trends have surfaced including a decrease in creative thinking scores among children in kindergarten through third grade rather than focus on what's wrong with the education system that has produced these outcomes armstrong lays out what creative thinkers know about how children should be educated in an extended thought experiment he asks what would happen if we turned the reins of educational policy over not to the politicians and educational bureaucrats but to eminent thinkers and creators like albert einstein pablo picasso martin luther king jr rachel carson doris lessing jane goodall and other seminal culture builders what might they say about the best way to educate a child if einstein ran the schools suggests that the answers to this intriguing question should guide future efforts to reform our nation's schools

teaching struggling and at risk readers a direct instruction approach is designed to provide specific information to assist educators in being effective teachers of reading with all of their students this three part book provides information on incorporating instructional design and delivery principles into daily instruction for students at the beginning and primary stages of reading it discusses structuring initial teaching procedures so teaching presentations are clear and foster a high degree of interaction between teachers and students using language and demonstration techniques that can be understood by all students sequencing the instruction of reading content to ensure essential skills and knowledge are taught in an aligned and coherent manner using techniques that provide adequate practice and review for students in developing high levels of fluency and accuracy
