johnson proposes a new model of second language acquisition sla a model that shifts the focus from language competence the ability to pass a language exam to language performance using language competently in real life contexts johnson argues that current sla theory and research is heavily biased in the direction of the cognitive and experimental scientific tradition she shows that most models of sla are linear in nature and subscribe to the conduit metaphor of knowledge transfer the speaker encodes a message the hearer decodes the sent message such models establish a strict demarcation between learners mental and social processes yet the origin of second language acquisition is located not exclusively in the learner s mind but also in a dialogical interaction conducted in a variety of sociocultural and institutional settings says the author drawing on vygotsky s sociocultural theory and bakhtin s literary theory she constructs an alternative framework for second language theory research teaching and testing this approach directs attention toward the investigation of dynamic and dialectical relationships between the interpersonal social plane and the intrapersonal individual plane johnson s model shifts the focus of sla away from a narrow emphasis on language competence toward a broader view that encompasses the interaction between language competence and performance original and controversial a philosophy of second language acquisition offers an introduction to vygotsky s sociocultural theory and bakhtin s literary theory both of which support an alternative framework for second language acquisition an examination of the existing cognitive bias in sla theory and research a radically new model of second language acquisition div div

this book takes a hard look at some of the assumptions that are customarily made concerning the role of age in second language acquisition the evidence and arguments the contributors present run counter to the notion that an early start in second language learning is of itself either absolutely sufficient or necessary for the attainment of native like mastery of a second language another theme of the book is a doubt that there is a particular stage of maturity beyond which language learning is no longer fully possible in short the book presents a challenge to those who take it as given that second language learning is inevitably different in its essential nature from language acquisition in the childhood years and that second language knowledge acquired beyond the critical period is in all circumstances and in all respects doomed
